1.	Chairs Remarks
	<ul> <li>Chair again thanked colleagues for attending online – welcome also extended to any new or returning members to the group.</li> <li>Discussion around future sub-groups and how this will be picked up further on in the meeting and at future meetings. Members requested to note upcoming groups and consider engagement.</li> <li>Sub-groups suggested so far include fleet and EVs, comms and engagement, behaviour change, strategy as well as energy and decarbonisation.</li> <li>Positive feedback given to group who worked on charter development as it gives a clear direction of travel and a solid foundation to start sustainability action.</li> <li>Previous meeting minutes reviewed as a means of following up assigned actions</li> </ul>
2.	<ul> <li>Sustainability Charter Update</li> <li>Sharon Luther presented the Sustainability Charter which has now been completed and will be shared with meeting minutes. Members thanked the working group for developing the charter with a special thanks to South Yorkshire Police Comms Team who supported in developing the look of the charter.</li> <li>The development group have also developed a briefing note to support members in bringing the charter into discussion with senior leaders.</li> <li>Discussion around how this could be escalated further across the FRS and Ambulance sectors. Action agreed with Nicci Stephens to discuss offline with Sharon Luther as a means of taking forwards within the Ambulance sector and Mathew Chard to take forwards to NFCC.</li> <li>Query raised around multi-signatories and capability of charter to do this as some may want PCC and Chief Constables to sign. Danielle Taylor confirmed charter has editable options in PDF to allow comments and additional signatories as well as addition of logos.</li> <li>Charter group to continue working together to consider how they take action against the charter forwards including ongoing reporting.</li> <li>ACTION: Members to consider sharing charter with Senior Leaders for sign-off.</li> <li>ACTION: Nicci Stephens and Sharon Luther to meet to assess best way to take charter forwards across</li> </ul>
	the Ambulance sector.  ACTION: Mathew Chard to share charter with NFCC Environment & Climate Change leads.

## 3. BlueLight Commercial, Jon Rawling (jon.rawling@bluelight.police.uk)

- Presentation covered structures in place to support sustainability action across the sector along with current related workstreams. Included within this is a sustainability governance board.
- One key area of support that BLC can offer is data collection and an activity has been undertaken to assess current state of play across the sector. Sheet including this information will be shared within the meeting notes and organisations are asked to review and respond directly to BLC if information is not correct or not present.
- One area of work underway is the development of a framework for EV charging and it is expected this will be complete by January 2022. Members also outlined a CCS EV framework currently in place – RM6213. This allows for dynamic purchasing on a call-off basis.
- Currently BLC work mainly with Police Forces but discussions are underway with some FRS and Ambulance Services.
- Query from some members around how data collection has taken place so far and who has responded to date as often the requests do not end up with the responsible individual within organisations for sustainability delivery. Members requested that BLC put requests through ESESG members as a means of acquiring the most up-to-date information.
- BLC to be invited to future meetings as permanent members.

**ACTION:** Members from Police Forces asked to review BLC information gathered to date and update or correct where necessary. Responses to go directly to Jon Rawling.

# 4. <u>Hysopt, David Taylor (david@hysopt.com)</u>

- Hyspot are a software company based in Belgium who are able to build digital twins to support design processes for renewable heating including verification of proposals for funding programmes such as PSDS.
- Hysopt are able to engage with organisations at the onset of PSDS bids and will also work with consultants. Essentially can take designs from RIBA stage 3 and progress through software programmes. Also confirmed that information from BMS can be inputted into the software.
- As part of PSDS 3, there is a free tool available online to plug-in information to assess current proposals and verify their content.
- Minimum information is typically floor plans, schematics, control strategy and energy consumption data.
- Query around generators and ability to input these was made and it was confirmed that they
  can be factored in with additional information such as DNO requirements.
- Hysopt happy to engage directly with any organisation with David Taylor the main point of contact.

# 5. Net-Zero Pathway, Annabel Harford (Avon FRS) and Simon Pyne, Greener Energy Futures (simon@greenerenergyfutures.net)

- Annabel Harford presented Avon FRS pathway to net-zero alongside Simon Pyne who supported the organisation on developing this pathway.
- Avon FRS have a really strong track record to date as portrayed by already achieving a 64% carbon reduction.
- Fleet emissions a challenge with diesel consumption a significant contributor to the overall carbon footprint with frontline vehicles being the main source. Salary sacrifice scheme for electric vehicles in place.
- Toolkit developed as part of developing net-zero pathway to help build a reduction trajectory which is based around actions within cycles.
- Significant proportion of future carbon reduction activity built into capital programmes with net-zero refurbishment and new builds planned.
- Assisting decision makers is a priority with consideration being given to a shadow carbon price to help embed carbon within overall process.
